#### **AIRVENTURE OSHKOSH 2006**

I made my first pilgrimage to EAA's Airventure Oshkosh this year, and for me it was the aviation celebration of a lifetime. If you haven't been there then put it on your calendar for a "must do" before you check out!

You can find everything aviation and almost everything non-aviation at Oshkosh ....

- Four huge hangars full of booths covering everything -- equipment; organizations (I visited the AMA booth); insurance; clothing & jewelry; colleges and academies to name a few.
- Every kind of mechanism which puts man in the air from the smallest to the largest.
- Rides. I took a ride in a Ford Trimotor and **ON** a BREEZY!
- Shuttle rides to be able to get around the enormous grounds with ease.
- Seminars galore. You can learn about everything aviation both practical and theoretical. The difficulty is making a choice.
- You can mix with some of the greats. General Chuck Yeager attended and talked about his experiences. He tells it like it is for sure, and the audience appreciated that! She jumped off the platform at the end of the session. A feat I wouldn't contemplate at 20 years her junior.
- Every day there was an airshow and Sean Tucker, Patty Wagstaff, the Liberty Parachute Team and the Aeroshell Team were among the performers. They made my Pitts S-2C flight look VERY tame!!!
- For those who preferred to stay out of the heat and in an air-conditioned building, the museum was a great place to be. I saw some R/C flying close to that area, but was on a shuttle so was not able to investigate.
- For those interested in shopping, there were plenty of places to do that, covering a multitude of items including equipment and incidentals to make life easier. I purchased a walking stick chair to give me a short break from the walking from time to time.






Well, I am pleased to announce that Mike Mance has stepped up to fill the role of club Newsletter Editor. The RCCR has a new address! No, I haven't moved again, and I'm still president. Phil Evans has obtained an "official" street number for our Bolling Field location through the Hamlin town assessor. Phil has also installed house numbers on the sign post at the entrance, and has posted the address on our frequency board. Keep this address handy, just in case.

Last time around, I mentioned that a committee had been formed to explore the issue of flying turbines at Northampton Park. The Turbine Committee met several times during the months of July and August. We decided to take a conservative approach in ensuring that turbine pilots can safely and reliably operate within the restrictions at Northampton before certifying turbine pilots to fly at Northampton. The following is the interim policy that we adopted by majority vote at the August 23, 2006:

- Possess a valid AMA turbine wavier & log book for examination, with a minimum of five turbinepowered flights recorded.
- Maiden test flights of turbine powered aircraft are not permitted at Northampton.
- Any high speed pass shall occur at the far side of the runway or beyond.
- AMA Wavier test and subsequent supervised flights may be done at Northampton providing the administering pilot has met RCCR requirements, and a buddy box system is used. These flights must be witnessed by at least two RCCR turbine committee members.
- Two practice flights must be performed at an alternate field with boundaries set to simulate conditions at Northampton. A demo flight then must be performed at Northampton. These flights must be witnessed by at least two RCCR turbine committee member. Pilots taking their wavier test at Northampton are excluded from this requirement.
- All AMA rules and safety procedures regarding the operation of turbines must be followed.

Pending the results of a vote at our first meeting in September, we will be adding two additional points to this policy. These will be published with the entire policy in the next issue.

Our annual Great Electric Fun Fly was a bit of a disappointment this year, as the weather did not cooperate. We did get over twenty hearty pilots who came out and braved the wind and rain, and they did manage to get in quite a few flights. One thing I can say is that if you get out to one of our events, try a Zweigle's red hot with Colonel Cooper's Famous Mile High Hot Sauce. THAT is what I call a good hot dog!

Don't forget the annual end-of-season picnic! We'll be at the Northampton Ski Lodge on Sunday, October 8, with dinner to start at 1PM. RCCR will provide hots, burgers, and drinks. Bring a dish to pass!
